Records were set in the new pool in every event, though none which may not be broken in the near future when State develops a more experienced team, and is brought into even more competition with teams of other Colorado schools. Invitations for meets have been sent to Mines and D.U., and if accepted, as is almost certain they will be, a regular team will be put through daily workouts and Varsity letters presented to the members at the end of the spring season.

Approximately 400 people witnessed the contests Tuesday. Apparently interest in the sport is running high, as evidenced by the hearty support given by the students to the first meet of its kind in Boulder.

One of the features of the afternoon was a short swimming exhibition by Coach Robinson of the Northwestern team. Among others he demonstrated the breaststroke, the backstroke, the crawl and variations of the float. He amazed the crowd with several trick strokes and two or three familiar strokes reversed.
